3 Stages (choose 1 or 2 or all 3)

A brand new concept in safaris, based on our favourite destinations and at the right time of the year. We have divided our safari into 3 stages and you can choose to join us for the whole time, or for any of the individual stages. The whole itinerary is definitely a should-do from end-to-end, but time and costs often limit our participants, so we have decided to create a very different approach which will offer options for the safari traveller.

1 - Zambia - across this great safari destination one area has continued to thrill our clients over the years, and that is the South Luangwa Valley. Based in the northern sector of the valley we shall spend three full days experiencing the wildlife far from the crowds - we rarely see other vehicles in this area. Truly.. Remote Africa !!

2 - Zimbabwe and Botswana - while tourists flock to the area around Victoria Falls, this tour does it a little differently. Imagine waking in your luxury tent and looking at the Zambezi River just 5 metres in front of you. Then on into Chobe National Park staying right away from the crowded northern area, yet seeing the hoardes of wildlife that descend on Chobe at this time of year. And then we fly across Lake Kariba to a paradise that has no other visitors but wildlife and us. Stretch your legs a little and take a gentle walk in the wilderness, or game-view in comfort from a vehicle or on the lake. This stage of our tour features gems that we have enjoyed for years and love sharing with our clients.

3 - Namibia - some 20 years ago we were appointed by Namibia Tourism to represent them in Australia. We commenced our safari business with Namibia as our favourite destination and so we continue to enjoy the magnetic appeal of this nation with our clients. We shall start by visiting the Himba and the Dhimba tribes of the north-west. Then we spend six nights in possibly the best National Park in southern Africa; Etosha. We are fortunate that we have already secured access to the remote western zone of the park, where less than 70 tourists per day can game-view as they please. Then it's on to visit the famous Okaukuejo restcamp, with its flood-lit waterhole, before continuing our journey across the eastern sector of the park.
